

• **MIAMI-DADE COUNTY
LAST CHARGE DROPPED
IN MURDER CASE**

Five days after he was acquitted of first-degree murder, a Miami man walked out of jail after prosecutors dropped a final weapons charge.

A jury Saturday acquitted Andrew Foster, 33, who was accused of fatally shooting Dwayne Bullard outside Honey's strip club in Northwest Miami-Dade in September 2003. A jury convicted Foster in 2007, but the Third District Court of Appeal overturned the verdict because a judge did not allow the defense to call certain alibi witnesses.

After the not guilty verdict, the judge kept Foster in jail on a separate charge of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

But prosecutors had to drop the charge because the accusation stemmed from the incident for which he had been acquitted.
